Our School / Notre école

École Corinthia Park School is a very busy place! Home to approximately 475 students from PreK to Grade 6, ECPS offers programming in English and French Immersion for Kindergarten through Grade 6. The addition of PreK this year allows us to provide programming for our youngest 3 and 4 year old students.

Our current school attendance boundaries include the Corinthia Park and Blackstone neighborhoods, as well as Southfork Phase 11 and beyond for students in English. French Immersion students from all areas east Highway 2, including rural, for French Immersion students, as well as the Blackstone and Woodbend neighbourhoods. This will change a bit with the Grade Reconfiguration in Leduc in the fall of 2024.

École Corinthia Park School staff endeavor to provide a warm and caring learning environment for our children. The staff are dedicated, hardworking and strive to bring out the best in all students.

ÉCPS is a great place to learn and grow, with our many academic, athletic and social opportunities for students.







So Much To Be Proud Of At ECPS



English and French Immersion Programming: We offer instruction in both official languages! We are one of only two schools in the city to provide French Immersion, which is available from Kindergarten to Grade 6.

<u>PreK Program:</u> We are so excited to have the PreK Early Intervention Program in our school. We now have 5 classes for our youngest students. Three and four year old students requiring support with speech and language, emotional regulation and/or medical needs can access a wealth of services and support through this program.

<u>School Clubs, Teams and Extracurricular:</u> Our students are given an opportunity to participate in a variety of activities while at school. Numerous diverse activities are available for students. These include, Leadership Club, Music and Drama, Ski Club and Art Club. Sports activities include Cross Country, Track and Field, Volleyball, Basketball, Outdoor Ed., Floor Hockey and Soccer.

Active Parent Association and School Council: ECPS boasts a very active Parent Association, whose members are always there to volunteer and support the school. Bake Sales, Hot Lunch and Popcorn Days are some of the extras provided to our students through the hard work of our PA. They also host family events such as the Welcome Back BBQ, the Family Halloween Dance and a Movie Night. We are so fortunate to have these dedicated parents.

Recognizing Success: Each Friday a school-wide assembly is held to help us recognize student achievements with our Student of the Week. School spirit and a sense of belonging are built as we get together to share information, welcome new students, celebrate success and have some fun singing and dancing together.





Outdoor Adventures: Whether it's a Fall Walk in the community or a day of tree study at Fred Johns' Park, our students like to be outdoors. Our Kindergarten classes spent a week at 'Nature School' exploring, playing and learning to get along with one another. And our PreK students have their own outdoor 'PreK Patio' where they play and explore from Fall through to Spring. Our grade 6 students can participate in Outdoor Education from January to June. They learn outdoor survival skills and apply them during two outdoor trips; one day trip to Miguelon Provincial Park and one weekend trip to Elk Island National Park.

Part of the Community: We recognize the importance of being part of the community and as such, we partner with local organizations. At times our students benefit from our community partnerships, such as receiving a Nutrition Grant from the President's Choice Children's Charity. We also received funds for snacks from Giant Tiger following our Terry Fox Run. The Leduc Food Bank also provides snacks and lunch items for students who may need these.

Other times our students give back to the community. The Grade 5 students supported the Leduc Food Bank by organizing a Fall Food Drive and there is a Day of Giving coming up soon. Our school is a collection site for Santa's Helpers, encouraging students to give to those who are less fortunate. The Terry Fox Run, Movember and Jump Rope for Heart allow students to learn about and raise money for health related causes. Our students also like to connect with the local seniors home by visiting on Halloween to do a costume parade, and sending cards and pictures to brighten their days.

1. Excellent PAT Results

Students performed well on the PATs in 2023, with our English students outscoring the provincial average by 15-22% in all subject areas and French Immersion students topping the provincial scores in Math by 20%.

Challenges at ÉCPS

Promoting and maintaining a strong French Immersion

<u>Program:</u> One of the significant challenges lies in attracting and retaining qualified teachers proficient in French language instruction. Over the past few years we have also noticed a decrease in enrollment and student enthusiasm for learning and speaking the French language. Lastly, the lack of available French resources for teachers can also hinder the program.



Class Size and Student Support:

The diverse needs and decreased education funding prove challenging in today's classrooms. Teachers are challenged and struggle with providing enough time and support to meet student needs.



Mental Health Services: More than ever students and their parents are struggling with children's mental health issues. There are more students who need help and support and the resources are stretched thin. Wait times to access free or low cost options are long and therefore students are not getting timely help.

Physical plant - modernization: ÉCPS

is in need of a modernization and update in many of the core building areas. These include the heating system, office & reception area, kitchen, washrooms, gymnasium, stage and the original classroom areas. Minimal changes have been made since the school was built and things are starting to show the wear and tear of decades of use.
